These are the rules for all sections, unless otherwise stated - All Exhibits, with the Society's Card attached, must be at the Exhibition Hall on Friday 21st October 2011 (14th October for photography) between 8:00am and 12:00noon when Section Stewards will be in attendance. Judging will commence at 12:30pm sharp. Only Stewards, Judges or their assistants are to remain in the Exhibition Hall during judging.

- Exhibits to be presented in clean condition.
- Names on exhibits to be covered.
- Any article having won a prize at a previous Narrogin Show is not eligible for entry.
- All articles must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Limit of three entries per exhibitor per class permitted, except photography 4 per class permitted.

Entry forms must be lodged by 3:00pm -

- Thursday 14th October 2011 for photography sections.
- Wednesday 19th October 2011 for paper craft sections.
- Thursday 20th October 2011 all other sections.

Entry fees must be paid in full prior to lodging exhibit/s friday morning.

ENTRY FEE is .50c unless otherwise stated.

1st Prize - \$2.00, 2nd Prize - \$1.00, 3rd Prize - Card only, unless otherwise stated.

EXHIBITS ARE NOT TO BE COLLECTED BEFORE 5:00 PM SATURDAY

Prize money can be collected from the cashier's desk at any time on Saturday of the show, however prize money not collected by 6:00pm will revert to the society. If you cannot collect prize money on the day, please arrange for someone to pick it up on your behalf.

POINTS ALLOCATION: Where there is a tie in the number of points gained, the winner will be decided on a count back. The Exhibitor gaining the most number of first places shall be declared the winner. Where there may only be one or two entries the Judge may decide not to give a first or second if entries are not worthy.

POINTS SYSTEM: 1st Place - 5 Points
2nd Place - 3 Points
3rd Place - 1 Point

The Chief Steward, Section Steward and Judges will resolve any disputes. Judges and Section Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and or class. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.

SECTION L – KNITTING AND CROCHET WORK

Judging Guide:

Casting on and off stitches done evenly in tension and not too tightly. Joining in of yarn, picking up of stitches around neck or armbands to be neat. Evenness of fabric and tension suited to yarn chosen (fine needles for the fine yarn). Proportion-state if wearer is out of general proportion (long arms). Suitability of yarn colour as regards pattern chosen (flecked or textured wool used in plain pattern). Pressing, seaming and making up. Buttons to be stitched on with matching wool. Any appropriate seaming method may be used. Flat seams on all children's garments. Fair Isle must be woven in at back of work. General finish, trimming and show appearance, may use crochet and or silk edge.

2 eggs
1¹/₃ cups self-raising flour
½ cup cocoa
⅔ cup water
