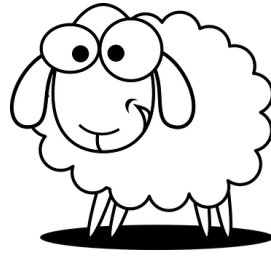

DISPLAY PENS: Pens will be available for any breeds of sheep at \$2.00 per head.

Please supply your own hay.

- **No residency limit for entries.**
- Points will be allocated to class size.
- Group Classes to be taken from exhibits.
- Any exhibit that, in the opinion of the Judges, does not comply with the conditions shall be disqualified. The Judge's decision in the matter is final. Shorn classes to be regulation shorn, unless otherwise stated.
- All Merino Sheep to be shown in full wool, unless otherwise stated. Number of days' growth of wool must be shown on entry form and also on tags provided by the Society, which must be attached to the exhibit.
- **Ages of Sheep:** Ages of Sheep must be computed up to the day of judging. Sheep competing in the under 1 ½ year old classes must not show more than two permanent teeth, and Sheep competing in the 1 ½ years and older classes must not show less than four permanent teeth.
- Champion Ribbons will be issued to the Champion Ram and Ewe in every Merino and Prime Lamb Breeds Section, also Champion Ewe in Farmers' Classes. Ribbons will also be issued to the Grand Champion Merino Ram (horned or polled) and Grand Champion Merino Ewe & Supreme Exhibit.

All exhibits must be from the present season's clip. The number of day's growth must be stated on the entry form and exhibit ticket. The judge has the right to transfer to the proper class, any exhibit which, has been wrongly entered. Lambs' wool must be under 5cm in length.

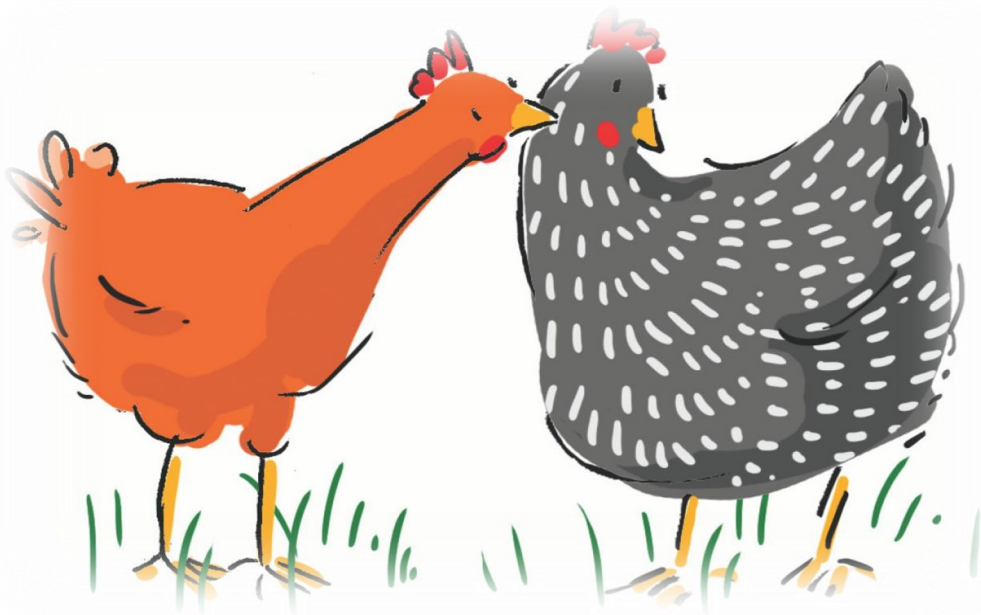


NARROGIN POULTRY SOCIETY

- All exhibits, with the society's card attached, other than Photography which can be left at office on nomination, must be at the exhibition hall on Friday 13th October 2023, **between 8:00am and 10.45am when Section Stewards will be in attendance.**
- Judging will commence at 11.30am onwards. Only stewards or their assistants & judges are to remain in the exhibition hall during judging.
- Exhibits to be presented in clean condition.
- Names on exhibits are to be covered on tickets.
- Any article having won a prize at a previous NAS Annual Show is not eligible for entry.
- All articles must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Limit of three (3) entries per exhibitor per class permitted
- No exhibits are to be left/stored at the Office prior to the Show commencing with the exception of photography.
- Exhibits are not to be collected before 4.30pm on Saturday, 14th October.
- No residency limit on entries.

POINTS ALLOCATION:

Where there is a tie in the number of points gained, the winner will be decided on a count back.

The Exhibitor gaining the most number of first places shall be declared the winner.

Where there may only be one or two entries the Judge may decide not to give a first or second if entries are not worthy.

POINTS SYSTEM: 1st Place—5 points
 2nd Place—3 points

**Overall Points section winners for Exhibition Hall will be on display at Section stands
(Collect award vouchers from Show Office—located in the control room at the Leisure Centre)**

Highly Commended may be awarded where there are seven (7) or more entries, or where the Judges may class an exhibit worthy of Commendation in Photography section only.

The Chief Steward, Section Stewards and Judges will resolve any disputes.

Judges and Section Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.

The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.

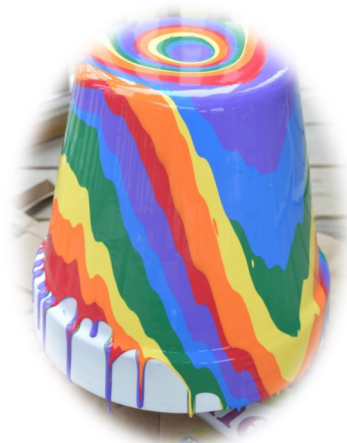

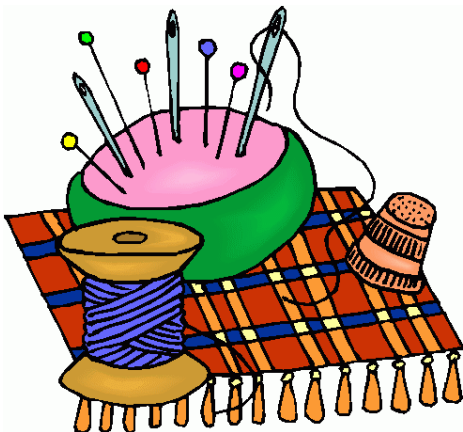

- All names on works to be covered please secure exhibit card to your section

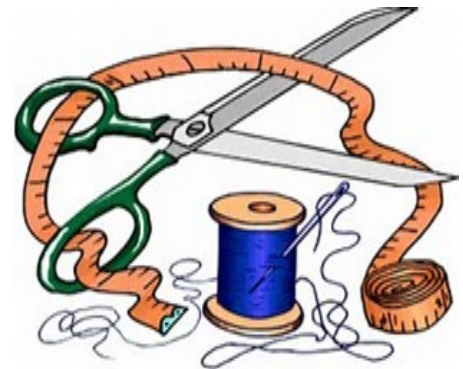
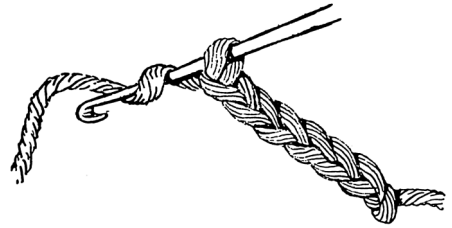

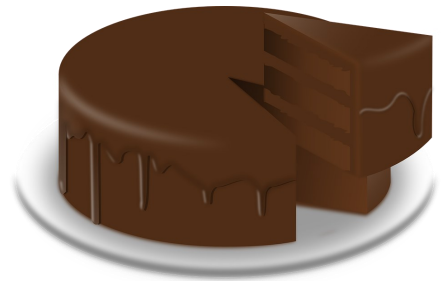

Photography Hints and Tips

Portrait

This is a photographic portrait of a person who is posing for the camera. The subject should be making eye contact with the viewer but this is not a hard and fast rule. The picture should show the subject's 'character and mood', whether it's happy, sad, serious, funny, etc. Lighting is very important and wherever possible natural light should be used. Flash can be used as a fill in if the subject is in shadow but try to avoid direct flash as this produces 'red eye' in the subject, looks unsightly and not suitable in competition. Keep the pose simple and comfortable and avoid

fussy or messy backgrounds. Avoid objects behind that look as if they are growing out of the subject's head. Chopping off part of a person in the photo is also undesirable unless you are using tight framing and only want the subject's head and shoulders in the photo.

Group Study

All of the previous comments apply. The object of this class is to produce a posed portrait of a group of people. Like a family or a wedding group. Again pay attention to background and lighting, don't have your subjects squinting into bright sunlight.

Pet or Animal Portrait

All of the rules that apply to humans apply to pets/animals. The pet/animal should fill as much of the picture frame as possible and again, check out your background for anything that will distract the viewer (and the judge) away from the subject. Try to get down to their level for best results.

Landscape and Study of Water

The object of the exercise is to try to convey to your viewers the things that interested you in the landscape in the first place. Composition is very important in a good landscape or study of water as is lighting. The time of day can turn a good scene into a flat one, early morning or late afternoon is usually the best, avoid midday sun. One of the hardest things to do in a photograph is to portray the slope of a hill since a photograph converts a three dimensional image to a two dimensional one. Have a look at a book on the subject for some ideas or ask a professional photographer.

Remember that the scene that attracted you will have to dominate the picture in order to interest others, so exclude all other distractions. If you are taking a photo of the horizon in a seascape make sure it is level, many good compositions have been penalized for tilted horizons.

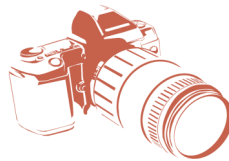
